Below you will find some extra devotional material with suggestions for crafts to cover the period from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday inclusively.

Palm Sunday

Readings and hymns as per previous sheet

This year we are not able to receive palm crosses in church, if you have a palm cross from a previous year, you could use that. Or you could make a cross from a sheets of A4 to use instead of a palm cross.

Doreen Horn shared a suggest on face book that she heard about which I have included below in case you might like to do something similar:

The members of Central Church Torquay have been discussing what to do about their traditional Easter floral cross. Because they cannot justify going out to prepare one at the church and few people will be passing anyway. They have decided to prepare individual ones. They can be floral, crated, large or small, on Easter Sunday they will be displaying their own floral crosses in their homes/windows.

I would suggest that we display a cross from a window starting on Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday then on Easter Sunday, either/or decorate the cross or replace it with a floral cross. Don't worry if you cannot do this

Palm Sunday prayer

Holy and loving God, help us to tell your story, that in the Passion of your Son Jesus, we are taken beyond our highest aspirations, and beneath our deepest fears. As we follow in the steps of Jesus, on into the city on this Palm Sunday, may we sense the joy yet prepare ourselves to share the tears. Make us strong to follow Jesus, so that, within ourselves, we know the peace that passes all understanding and the love that knows no limits. In the name of Jesus, our Saviour, Amen.

Maundy Thursday

This is usually observed in the church by have a fellowship meal sometimes this can be more symbolic with elements from a Jewish Seder meal being shared, this would then be followed by the sharing of Holy Communion. Words and reflections then take us through the events that took place after the meal that Jesus shared with his disciple, the garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus anxiety can be sensed from how he prays and how he speaks to his disciples. His arrest and the scattering of the Disciples.
